> U-M Professor Joseph Beal Steere arrived in the Philippines in 1874 on the behalf of the University of Michigan to build up its museum collections. He traveled all over the country, including islands previously not studied by other American ornithologists. The UMMAA's portion of the Beal-Steere Collection includes (among other objects) assorted weapons, two coats, and a bow for a stringed instrument.

Biography

In 1870, Joseph Beal Steere, an ornithologist, traveled the world to build upon the University of Michigan's varied museum collections. His voyage was paid for by his mother's cousin Rice A. Beal (hence the inclusion of "Beal" in the name "Beal-Steere Expedition"), owner of the local newspaper the *Ann Arbor Courier*, on the condition that Steere send back letters of his travels to be published. After traveling and collecting in South America as well as East and Southeast Asia, he arrived in the Philippines in June 1874. He departed the Philippines in late May/early June of 1875, eventually arriving in Ann Arbor, Oct. 21, 1875. During this time he traveled all over the Philippines, returning



most frequently to the country's capital, Manila. He collected animal and plant specimens, as well as cultural materials.

Collection Scope and Content Note

The majority of this collection consists of various ethnographic objects, including weapons, hunting instruments, clothing, a basket, a broom, and a horn. All items were collected between the years 1874-1875 in the Philippines.

The collection as a whole has not been attributed to any Philippine ethnolinguistic groups. A cultural expert has not reviewed the collection; the catalog information reflects what has been previously provided by the donor and the Museum's historic naming conventions. At this time, it cannot be stated with specificity when, where, or by whom the objects were created.

The collection contains human remains and associated burial items.
