Biography

Karl L. Hutterer is an American anthropologist and archaeologist who has published prolifically on the Philippines and other areas of Southeast Asia. He is Director Emeritus of the Santa Barbara Museum of Natural History, and was previously curator of the University of Michigan's Museum of Anthropological Archaeology Asian division.

Collection Scope and Content Note

All ethnobotanical samples were collected by Hutterer in Samar, Philippines, 1971. The collection originated from field work done by Hutterer at this time in Southern Samar, who was following up on a previously discovered site in that area. Part of this work was done in collaboration with David Tuggle, who was running a summer field school out of the University of Hawaii. The results of Hutterer and Tuggle's 1971 field work is published in *Archaeology of the Sohoton Area, Southwestern Samar, Philippines* (1972). The ethnographic objects were collected by William Parry, and include bows, arrows, and arrow points.

The collection has not been attributed to any Philippine ethnolinguistic groups. The collection has also not been reviewed by an individual with expertise in Philippine ethnolinguistic cultures. The catalog information reflects what has been previously provided by the donor and the Museum's historic naming conventions. At this time, it cannot be stated with specificity when, where, or by whom the objects were created.
