Biography

William M. Trap was born in 1887. He was a professor at the University of Michigan 1923-1925, and continued his career at Wayne State University from 1926-1955. From 1913-1918 he served as an active minister at the Christian Reformed Church. Trap died in 1958.

John Abraham Van den Broek was born in 1885. He was a professor at the University of Michigan beginning in 1914. Van den Broek died in 1959.

Collection Scope and Content Note

The collection contains 17 assorted weapons collected by J. A. Van den Broek and purchased from William M. Trap. The exact dates and circumstances of collection are not known. The University acquired the collection with the help of John A. Van den Broek.



The collection has not been attributed to any Philippine ethnolinguistic groups. The collection has also not been reviewed by an individual with expertise in Philippine ethnolinguistic cultures. The catalog information reflects what has been previously provided by the donor and the Museum's historic naming conventions. At this time, it cannot be stated with specificity when, where, or by whom the objects were created.
